Eighty-five percent of the total SDPD budget is used directly for personnel, leaving only 15% for critical communication, safety and evidence collection tools and software, not to mention crime prevention programs and community outreach efforts.

During 12 years of grant making, the Foundation has reached many milestones and awarded more than \$4 million to the San Diego Police Department, ensuring our men and women in blue have the right tools.

2014 SDPD Needs



EVERY DIME FIGHTS CRIME.

Life Saving Trauma Kits - \$250 will outfit one officer with two kits.

Two police officers' lives have already been saved since trauma kits were deployed within the SWAT Team. Our goal is to outfit each SDPD officer with a trauma kit and its ready replacement in order to keep our first-responders prepared in all circumstances.

Time-lapse Cameras - \$1,450 will provide the Robbery Unit with four cameras and security boxes.

This equipment is needed by the Robbery Unit to aid in their surveillance efforts. Photographic evidence is often key to strong court cases.

250 Traffic Control Wands - \$3,575 will outfit SDPD officers with 250 wands and 500 batteries.

Bright traffic control wands are needed to assist officers and volunteers assigned to direct traffic. These will be a boost to road safety, especially at night.

Lock Pick Kits - \$6,350 will fund 250 lock pick kits.

Lock-pick kits are needed to assist officers conducting welfare checks on elderly and infirm San Diegans. Currently, officers are incurring this cost themselves.

Seat Belt Punch Tools - \$14,450 will provide 2,000 lifesaving tools to officers.

These small devices would make it easy for officers to cut seatbelts and break car windows in the event of a vehicular emergency.

Vehicle Truck Vaults - \$20,690 will ensure security for 10 vehicles.

Vehicle vaults are used to secure tactical and investigative equipment in vehicles so they are on hand when units are deployed on scene.

Ballistic Shields - \$70,950 will outfit the SWAT team with 50 protective shields.

These shields are light-weight and can be rolled up to fit in minimal space. They act as additional ballistic protection for officers in dangerous situations.

Mobile Device Forensics Lab - \$160,000 will provide SDPD with a vital new lab.

A mobile device forensics lab would serve as a central repository when impounding cell phones and allow the Department to access data on the impounded phones and enhance investigations.
